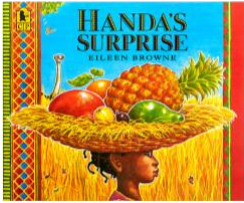


Spelling Scavenger Hunt Grades K-2

The sneaky monkey loves this fruit the most:

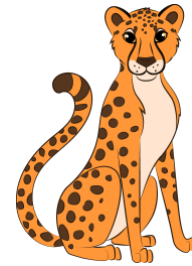

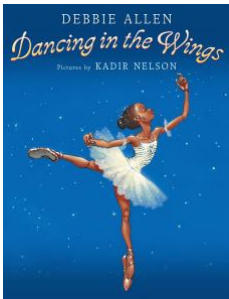


Spelling Scavenger Hunt Grades 3-5

Stories are a great way to have fun learning! Work in groups to learn about the featured stories by solving the clues.

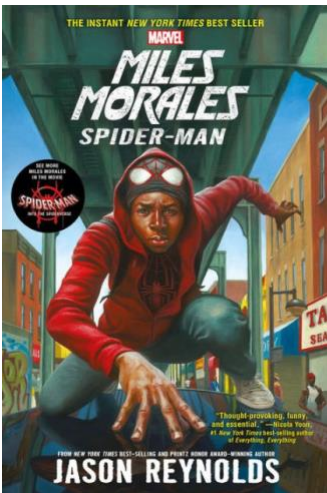
Clue #1
